### **Objectives of the Program:**

To create awareness among 6th semester CSE students about the placement process, timelines, and eligibility criteria.

- Participants became more aware of professional etiquette and placement ethics, preparing them for real-time placement scenarios.

### **Brief Report:**

The Department of Computer Science and Engineering at RVITM recently organized Placement Training for the students of 6th semester.

A comprehensive placement training session was conducted for the 6th semester Computer Science and Engineering students with the aim of preparing them for the upcoming placement season. The session focused on boosting students' confidence, enhancing their understanding of the placement process, and guiding them on effective preparation strategies.

The session began with an overview of placement ethics and professional behavior, highlighting the importance of maintaining honesty, responding promptly to placement messages, and dressing formally during interviews. The structure of salary packages (CTC breakdown) was explained in detail, helping students differentiate between fixed and variable pay, deductions, and in-hand salary.

Various types of companies—product-based, service-based, startups, and MNCs—were discussed to help students align their preparation according to their target roles. Students were also introduced to multiple online platforms like LeetCode, GeeksforGeeks, InterviewBit, and LinkedIn for structured preparation in coding, aptitude, and communication skills.

The session emphasized the importance of consistency, communication with the SPC (Student Placement Coordinator), and avoiding unethical practices like lying about backlogs or certifications. Students actively participated in activities, scenario discussions, and Q&A rounds, making the session highly engaging.
